Main Street Waterloo and Iowa Irish Fest have teamed up with Cedar Ridge Winery & Distillery to host a FREE hand sanitizer drive-up on May 1st.

With the visitor center closed, Cedar Ridge Winery & Distillery has found a way to put their alcohol to good use and keep their staff fully employed. After handing out over 5,000 free bottles to the community, they realized the need was far greater than anyone could have anticipated.

The organizations will come together and set up in the Young Arena (125 Commercial St.) parking lot on May 1 from 11AM to 1PM to hand out free personal size bottles while supplies last.

Inundated with requests from businesses and organizations looking to purchase larger quantities, Cedar Ridge created 1 quart, 1 gallon and 5 gallon bulk size containers, with the goal in mind to get hand sanitizer into the hands of people that need it most. The Waterloo Urban Farmers Market season opener has been postponed until **Saturday**, **May 16th** and is scheduled to run through Oct 31st at the RiverLoop Expo Plaza 8:00AM - 12:00PM (460 Jefferson Street).

Governor Kim Reynolds released a proclamation on April 24, 2020 giving lowa farmers markets approval to open with the addition of mandatory requirements being in place. To prevent the spread of COVID-19, the following protective measures will be in place:

- Only food and farm products will be available
- All entertainment and activities have been canceled
- There will be no common seating areas
- Six feet spacing has been added between vendor booths
- Reasonable measures will be taken to ensure social distancing among all market goers

In addition to these protective measures, the Waterloo Urban Farmers Market will be offering an all-new online ordering, curbside pick up market program. Customers will now be able to shop for products online and pick up their order curbside.

My Waterloo Days involves a great deal of preparation, and due to the interference in planning that COVID-19 has caused, we felt as though it would be irresponsible for us to continue to move forward with the event.

We will be postponing the 2020 Rock the Park theme until June 7-13 in 2021, and will be creating several virtual events for this year's My Waterloo Days. While we are disappointed we will not be able to physically be with our community members for this year's event, we still want to provide an opportunity to connect. The virtual events will include: the parade, a self reporting fun run with costume contest, a car show, a youth talent show, and Facebook live entertainment.

Again, we are saddened by the effects that COVID-19 has caused on the 2020 My Waterloo Days event. Please know this decision was not an easy one for us to make, but we are hoping to make our 2021 event even better. We appreciate the support that we have received from the community thus far, and have no doubt you will continue to support us in this decision.
